

ATTENTION 6TH GRADE PARENTS:

The Ohio Department of Health school immunization requirements include a dose of M CV4 (meningococcal) vaccine and a dose of T dap (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccine BEFORE a student enters the seventh grade.

Please check with your medical provider to see if your student has had these immunizations. You can have them fax your student's updated shot record directly to the school. If your student has not had these immunizations, please contact your doctor or the Health Department to schedule an appointment. The Health Department provides vaccines for a nominal charge. No one will be denied vaccination at the Health Department for inability to pay.

These immunizations can be obtained anytime from now until the first day of 7th grade. If you have any questions, please call me at 273-3314.

Attention parents/guardians who drop off and pick up students each day:

Drop off is going well for the most part. The lines have been long, but we are working to get cars moving as quickly as possible. As a reminder, if you are first in line please pull all the way up to the cone to drop off. You may let your students out all the way back to the handicap area. We ask that students have all of their things ready to go

when getting out of the car. If there is a problem, please pull out of the line into one of the parking spaces. This helps keep the line moving quickly.

Pick up does not have the same process, but does occur in the same location. Unlike some of the elementary buildings, we do not provide curbside service. We ask that you park in the spaces and wait for your child to come out. Please do not pull up to the curb because you could be blocking other cars from leaving. This can be dangerous for students who are walking in and out of cars as well.

Remember: If cones are not up and administrators are not able to be outside, please follow the process as usual. If we all work together, we can get students dropped off in a safe and timely manner. If you are willing to help us with the drop off or pick up process, please let us know. We welcome volunteers to help keep the process running smoothly. Volunteers must have a background check/fingerprinting. Contact the office if you are interested.
