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Types of College Admission

- **Early Decision** (10/15-11/15)- Binding
- **Early Action** (11/1-12/15)- Non-Binding
- **Regular**- Non-Binding, Final Deadline
- **Rolling**- Non-Binding, No Deadline



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Tips for Essays

- Colleges use essays to learn more about you. Many individuals just like you (similar grades, ranks, exam scores) apply, but what makes you an asset to the school?
- Write what you think is important, not what you think is important to the school.
- Have someone check your and read your essay. This will avoid typos and misspellings; the word “college” is the most misspelled word!



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Tips for Essays (Continued)

- Be sure to send the correct essay to the correct college.
- Do not use poor grammar, vulgar language (email address included), or plagiarize your work.
- Miami University reviewed over 27,000 essays last year; reviewed by just 12 people!



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Tips for Recommendation Letters

- Some applications ask for recommendation letters in addition to your current grades and transcripts.
- It is wise to ask for a recommendation from more than one individuals and supply each with facts about yourself (datasheet).
- Please, please, please give at least two weeks notice!



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Tips for the ACT/ SAT

- What is the difference between ACT/ SAT? Do I need to take both tests? Which should I take?
- All Juniors – ACT this spring
- The ACT is offered at Talawanda in September, October, December, February, April, and June. The writing portion of the test is offered during these dates.
